WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 46 of the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1976, that the Governor may by proclamation declare that such places in Western Australia as he thinks fit are circuit towns; and whereas it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 10 of the Juries Act, 1957-1976, that the jury district for the Supreme Court and for each Circuit Court, shall consist of such Assembly District or Districts or such part or parts of such Assembly District or Districts, as the Governor determines and declares, and is thereby authorized to determine and declare by proclamation from time to time; and whereas it is enacted by subsection (3) of section 10 of the Juries Act, 1957-1976 that where a circuit town is declared after the coming into operation of that Act pursuant to the power conferred by section 46 of the Supreme Court Act, 1935 or any other Act for the time being in operation, the Governor may by the proclamation declaring the circuit town, or by subsequent proclamation, declare what Assembly District or Districts or part or parts of an Assembly District or Districts or part or parts of an Assembly District for the Circuit Court or parts of an Assembly District or Districts, shall constitute the jury district for the Circuit Court of the circuit town so proclaimed: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby

- (a) declare that the place specified in the first column of the Schedule to this proclamation is a circuit town;
- (b) determine and declare the jury district for the Circuit Court of the circuit town specified in the first column of the Schedule to this proclamation shall con-stitute that part of the Assembly District

- specified opposite and corresponding to that circuit town in the second column of the Schedule to this proclamation;
- (c) assign to the jury district specified in the second column of the Schedule to this proclamation the name specified opposite and corresponding to that jury district in the third column of the Schedule to this proclamation.

- (v) Except as otherwise provided in these regulations, the fees prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for Returning Officers and Deputy Returning Officers shall cover all services required by the Act or by regulation, to be performed by the officer in connection with an election and for an Assistant Returning Officer all services required on polling day.
- (vi) Where an officer does not reside in the district for which he has been appointed as Returning Officer, Deputy Returning Officer or Assistant Returning Officer, if he is required to travel to the district to which he has been appointed prior to the day of the election for the purpose of performing his duties, he shall be paid a travelling allowance in accordance with regulation 64 for the whole period of his absence from his residence in connection with those duties.
- (vii) When an election for the Legislative Council is held on the same day as an election for the Legislative Assembly and the Returning Officer for the Legislative Assembly District is also Returning Officer or Deputy Returning Officer for the Legislative Council Province for the purposes of those elections, and he carries out duties in relation to both elections, the following provisions apply—

- (f) Persons who are officers within the meaning of that expression as used in the Public Service Act, 1904, when acting as Returning Officers, Deputy Returning Officers, Assistant Returning Officers, Presiding Officers, Assistant Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks, or Doorkeepers on the day of an election shall be deemed to be absent from their public service offices on leave of absence with payment of salary in respect of those offices.
- 62. When on the day of an election or on any Sunday next following the election, or after the ordinary working hours as provided by Public Service Regulations on any subsequent day, until the result of the election has been ascertained any member of the staff of the State Electoral Department is instructed by the Chief Electoral Officer to be and remain at the State Electoral Department to carry out his normal duties, or such other duties in connection with the election that may be allotted to him, he shall be paid overtime or granted time off in lieu, as the case may be, as prescribed under the industrial agreement for the time being in force, or from time to time in force, between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) and the Public Service Board of Western Australia.

In all other cases, when any person is engaged on the staff of the State Electoral Department on the day of an election, he shall, with the approval of the Chief Electoral Officer, be paid the same fees as prescribed by paragraph (c) of the last preceding regulation as those to which he would have been entitled if he had in fact been specially appointed as Presiding Officer, Assistant Presiding Officer, Poll Clerk, or Doorkeeper, for the election.

- 63. Where in accordance with the provisions of section 156 Returning Officers are required after an election to prepare a list of the electors who failed to vote at the election contrary to the requirements of that section, the Returning Officers shall be entitled to receive and retain for preparing the list a special fee calculated at the rate of \$5.70 for every 500 or portion of 500 votes polled.
- 64. (1) Officers who are required to travel outside the metropolitan area for the purpose of performing their duties as Electoral Officers shall be entitled to such travelling allowance as is prescribed under the industrial agreement for the time being in force or from time to time in force between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) and the Public Service Board of Western Australia.

Provided that no transport allowance shall be paid to any officer in respect of the day of the election, but if approved by the Chief Electoral Officer, any expense necessarily incurred by an officer for transport on the day of the election may be recouped to the officer,

(2) Officers who are required to perform services throughout the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 8.30 p.m. on polling day shall be entitled to the payment of \$2.60 as reimbursement for the cost of the evening meal.

OFFENDERS PROBATION AND PAROLE ACT, 1963-1976.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council acting under the Provisions of the Offenders Probation and Parole Act, 1963-1976 and section 11 of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1975 has been pleased to make the regulations set forth in the Schedule below to take effect on and from the day that the Offenders Probation and Parole Act Amendment Act, 1976 comes into operation.

Regulations.

- 1. In these regulations the Offenders Probation and Parole Regulations, 1964 published in the Government Gazette on the 16th April, 1964 and reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 and published in the Government Gazette on the 25th January, 1967 and amended by a notice so published on the 13th August, 1969 are referred to as the principal regulations.
- 2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended by adding in the appropriate numerical sequence the following passage:—

PART XIIA.—Community Service Orders.

3. The principal regulations are amended by adding immediately after regulation 31 the following regulations and heading:—

Part XIIA.—Community Service Orders.

31A. In this Part-

- "area supervisor" means a supervisor appointed as supervisor in relation to a number of community service projects or in a particular area of the State;
- "Community Service Order Co-ordinator" means a probation officer designated by the Chief Probation and Parole Officer to be the Community Service Order Co-ordinator.
- 31B. A community service order shall be in the form or to the effect of Form I in the Schedule to these regulations.
- 31C. (1) The Chief Probation and Parole Officer may appoint persons as supervisors or area supervisors to supervise the carrying out of community service orders by offenders and may at any time revoke such an appointment.
- (2) The Chief Probation and Parole Officer shall issue to each supervisor a certificate of appointment.
- 31D. An area supervisor is responsible for supervising the carrying out of community service orders by offenders in the area of the State specified in his certificate of appointment.
- 31E. A supervisor shall ensure that any direction given by the relevant officer in relation to a community service order is carried out by the offender in respect of whom the community service order is made.
- 31F. A supervisor shall whenever required to do so report to the Community Service Order Co-ordinator on any matter relating to an offender under his supervision.
- 31G. A person shall not act as supervisor in respect of a community service order made in relation to any work under which he would obtain any benefit unless the benefit accrues to him as a member of a group within the community or as a member of the community.
- 31H. Subject to the directions of the Community Service Order Coordinator, a supervisor may excuse an offender from attending on any day under a community service order or may excuse an offender from continuing to do any community service required of that person under a community service order on any day, if the supervisor is satisfied that there are reasonable grounds for so doing.
- 31I. (1) An offender who does not attend at a time and place as required under the directions of the relevant officer on the grounds of sickness shall on his next attendance or as soon as possible thereafter produce a medical certificate signed by a legally qualified medical practitioner certifying that he was not able to attend because of his sickness.
- (2) Where an offender is unable by reason of sickness to report to a supervisor at the time and place required by a direction given by a relevant officer he shall, if possible, inform the supervisor of that fact before that time and shall as soon as possible forward to the supervisor a certificate to that effect signed by a legally qualified medical practitioner.
- (3) Any time not worked by an offender by reason of sickness shall not be regarded as time worked for the purposes of the community service order.

SCHEDULE—continued.

- 31J. An offender who has been directed to wear any safety clothing and equipment in carrying out a community service order shall give effect to that direction.
 - 31K. (1) An offender shall not-
 - (a) report for the purpose of carrying out a community service order under the influence of drugs or alcohol to such an extent that he is unfit to properly carry out the order;
 - (b) consume any intoxicating liquor or take any drugs during the time that he is required to perform a community service order;
 - (c) wilfully damage or, deface anything supplied to him for the purpose of performing the community service order; or
 - (d) wilfully damage or disfigure any property on which or in relation to which he is required to carry out a community service order unless such damage or disfigurement is necessary for carrying out the order.
- (2) Where a supervisor is of the opinion that an offender is under the influence of drugs or alcohol at the time that he is carrying out a community service order or about to carry out such an order he may direct the offender to cease work.
- (3) Any time not worked pursuant to a direction given under subregulation (2) of this regulation shall not be regarded as time worked by the offender.
- 31L. (1) Where an offender is required to attend at a particular place for the purpose of carrying out a community service order and finds that he will not be able to do so the offender shall give the supervisor appointed in relation to that work reasonable notice of his inability to attend.
- (2) Where an offender is injured during the performance of a community service order the supervisor may, if he is satisfied that the circumstances of the case warrant it, allow the offender to cease work for the remainder of that day and any time granted under this regulation shall be regarded as time worked under the community service order.
- 31M. An offender is required to carry out the community service order during the hours specified in the order made in relation to him.
- 31N. (1) An offender carrying out a community service order is allowed three breaks during a normal working day as follows:—

two short breaks of ten minutes each—one in the morning and one in the afternoon; one break of 45 minutes for lunch.

- (2) Any time that is taken off by an offender under subregulation (1) of this regulation shall be regarded as time worked by him under the community service order.
- 31O. (1) Where an offender complies with a direction by a relevant officer to report to a supervisor at a time and place for the purpose of performing community service and the supervisor or the relevant officer does not arrive at that place within one hour of the time at which the offender was to report for community service the offender shall not be liable to perform community service on that day, unless alternative arrangements can be made.
- (2) The time during which the offender was to have performed community service under the preceding section shall be deemed to be time worked by the offender in compliance with the community service order.
- 31P. Where a relevant officer is satisfied that suitable transport is not available to convey an offender to or from the place where the offender has been directed to report for community service, the relevant officer or the supervisor may provide that offender with transport to or from that place or for any part of the journey to or from that place.
- 31Q. Where an offender, in accordance with the direction of a relevant officer, reports to a supervisor for community service and is then transported to a place of work, the time taken to transport him to and from the place of work shall be deemed to be part of the period of work.
- 31R. (1) An area supervisor who is not an officer under the Public Service Act, 1904 or an employee of any State service as defined under section 5 of that Act may be paid—
 - (a) a remuneration at the rate fixed by the Under Secretary for Law from time to time in respect of any service rendered by him; and
 - (b) travelling expenses for travel necessarily undertaken by him at the rate prescribed under any agreement or award applicable to officers under the Public Service Act, 1904.
- (2) A supervisor who is not an officer under the Public Service Act, 1904 or an employee of any State service as defined by section 5 of that Act may be paid travelling expenses for travel necessarily undertaken by him at the rate prescribed under any agreement or award applicable to officers under the Public Service Act, 1904.
- 31S. A community service advisory committee shall meet on at least two separate occasions in each calendar year.
- 31T. The minutes of the meetings of a committee shall be recorded by a person designated by the Chief Probation and Parole Officer as minutes secretary.
